The Lakeside Village of Byron
Parke County, IN

My husband and I first learned of the Lakeside Village of Byron at a fundraising auction for our boys' preschool. One of the items offered was a weekend retreat at the village, and when we saw the photos and read the description of the area, we could not resist bidding. We won the bid not fully knowing what would be in store for us. Since then, however, we have become raving fans of this unique resort community.

Situated approximately two and one-half hours southeast of Chicago, the Lakeside Village of Byron offers an affordable, low-key alternative to densely populated resort destinations like Lake Geneva, Wisconsin and Lakeside, Michigan. Moreover, because it is south of Chicago, the weather is milder, allowing for outdoor activities as late as Thanksgiving weekend.

The Lakeside Village of Byron is a planned community on the shore of a 360-acre lake surrounded by dense forest. Designed by the Chicago firm Soucie Horner, Ltd., each home is inspired by the classic American farmhouse. With several different models to choose from, the

homes are custom built in a casual yet elegant style with large kitchen/great rooms at their core. There is also the option to add a bunkhouse or guest cottage, creating private space for your guests and children's friends.

An ideal destination for families who want to spend time together outside, Lake Waveland is perfect for swimming, boating, fishing, and waterskiing, followed by camp songs and s'more roasting around the communal fire pit at the lake's edge. There are also three state parks nearby: Turkey Run State Park, Shades State Park and the Pine Hills Nature Preserve – perfect for hiking, biking, and exploration. The renowned hiking trails at Pine Hills lead to a geologic formation known as the Devil's Backbone. Other amenities include golf, horseback riding, and rafting.

The surrounding community is magical. Just down the road is one of Indiana's largest Amish communities, a great place to shop for fresh, locally grown produce. Parke County is the "Covered Bridge Capitol of the World" – you won't want to miss the Covered Bridge Festival in October and the Maple Syrup Festival held each February.
